Kia ora e te whānau,

How great is it to see events back on the school calendar, many of our students have re-engaged quickly with after school sports, representing the school and demonstrating our values in the wider community. Thank you to everyone who attended the parent teacher interviews this term. Having parents once again on-site gave the feel of returning to something more like normal and the energy at school was lifted. For us it highlighted the importance of working alongside you as parents in your child's education. If you were unable to attend parent interviews, please check the KAMAR portal which is being updated with your child's course of study (Years 11-13). You are also able to email your child's teacher for an update or to make an appointment.

The winter months are settling in and we are working hard to ensure adequate ventilation exists in classrooms whilst maintaining a comfortable temperature. We are a part of the Ministry's ventilation project and are monitoring CO2 levels in several classrooms. This data will help inform our needs. Students are encouraged to bring a black jacket to school to wear and keep warm. Masks continue to be encouraged and a reminder that if students are unwell, they should remain home. Thank you for your continued support in getting your children to school on time. We continue to focus on regular attendance here at school and we certainly notice the difference in engagement, school pride and achievement when learners are here regularly. Being on time means your child settles into the routine of the day and feels relaxed and confident, lateness puts them on the back foot from the onset. Please do not hesitate to contact me should you wish to discuss any difficulties you may be having in regard to getting your child to school.

Teacher Only Day was a valuable time for us as teachers to focus on the Literacy and Numeracy Co-requisites for NCEA. These are an indicator for learners that the foundations of literacy and numeracy are strong as they move into future pathways. Literacy and Numeracy will be taught across the curriculum. With students being given several opportunities to achieve the co-requisites in years 10-12. The co-requisites will not carry any credits for NCEA but are required in order to achieve NCEA.

We are currently planning a range of activities for our Matariki celebrations. We will be hoping to tie these in with celebrations happening in the township. This year will see the whole of New Zealand officially mark Matariki with a public holiday on the 24th June. Matariki provides an ideal opportunity to explore and pass on and sustain aspects of our culture and heritage. It is of course a time of celebration and the sharing of food and stories, to this end we will be hosting a Matariki breakfast on Thursday 23rd June (8:30am – 10:30am). This will be an opportunity for you to come along and share some kai with our rangatahi and Kaiako and have a look at some of the activities and mahi they have been engaged in throughout the week. We look forward to catching up with you then.

Messages to Students


If you wish to leave a message for your child, this must be phoned through to the College office by 11:30 am. We cannot promise that messages will get to your child if left after 12 noon.

Leaving the College Grounds

All students who leave the college during the day **MUST** have permission from the school as well as their parents/caregivers contacting the college office to advise a reason for leaving. The students **MUST** sign out through the office. Late students and those returning to the college **MUST** sign in at the office. Exeat passes are available to town students who wish to go HOME ONLY FOR LUNCH on a regular basis. Reminder to Senior students – if you wish to drive a vehicle to school you must collect a permission form from the office and get this signed by a parent/caregiver and return to the office. Note that you need to bring your driver's licence to the office to be copied. (A new form needs to be filled in every year so although you did this last year you need to do it again this year).

Reminder - Attendance

Students should ensure they are at school and in their Form Class by 8:40am and leave by 3:00 pm unless otherwise indicated. If your son or daughter is absent, please contact us by 9:00 am on the day of the absence, with your child's name, reason for the absence and the name of the person phoning in. Absences can also be put through using the Kamar app on your phone. Any problems accessing this app please contact the College office. Automatic texts will be sent to parents/caregivers for unexplained absences. Students arriving late **MUST** sign in at the office when they arrive.

District Finals will be held throughout NZ during May and June 2022 to determine the winners per district. These winners will travel to the National Finals to be held in Wellington. All travel to the finals is at the expense of New Zealand Lions Clubs. The National Finalists will be required to deliver the two speeches as aforementioned.
