
I look forward to meeting with you over the course of the next few weeks.

Kia tu Fridays

Friday is the best day of the week at Aparima College because you get to pick what activity you want to do. You can choose from a wide variety of options including Toi Māori, where you learn to speak Te Reo, do Mau Rakau, Poi dancing and Māori art such as making tukutuku panels. The Science behind Food

Week 1 - We used cream to make butter, we compared different techniques to see if any were faster or better. We found that smaller amounts of cream turned to butter faster when shaken in jars, a manual whisk takes the longest and an electric beater works fast but makes a lot of mess.

We separated out the buttermilk from the butter, washing the butter well under running cold water to remove all of the buttermilk. This was to stop the butter going rancid.

We then used the leftover buttermilk to make pikelets with jam and some cream we saved.

The butter we made is going to be flavoured next week and used on the naan we are going to make. Week 2 we are looking at the science of how yeast affects bread making.

We Welcome Mrs Doreen Lata, our new Head of Mathematics

Mrs Lata has come to Aparima College to teach Mathematics and Physics. She comes from Fiji, where the population is a fifth of the size of New Zealand's. There are only two seasons in Fiji, with temperatures ranging from 21 to 30+ degrees. Her husband, Mr Narayan, has come to teach Mathematics and Chemistry. He loves fishing and recently caught a 35kg Kawakawa fish. Mrs Lata loves reading, and also loves spicy food and even brought spices with her. She makes roti (flat bread) every day for lunch along with curry. She and her family visited New Zealand and really liked it, so they returned to Fiji to organise their paperwork to get a visa that would allow them to work here to teach Maths and Science. Mrs Lata has come with her husband Mr Narayan and their two daughters, Disha in Year 7 and Krishi in Year 9. They arrived in Auckland on 16th January and watched the Rugby Sevens. In Fiji, rugby is a favourite sport. There are many differences between Fijian and NZ classrooms, including class size. In Fiji class sizes can be up to 40 students! In Fiji, Maths is compulsory through to Year 13, and they have to do both Statistics and Calculus. In NZ we have smaller classes and have less content. In Fiji the curriculum is very rigid, broad and mandatory, so students would not have the opportunities to take options and have flexible days such as our Kia Tu Fridays. All students take examinations and there is lots of pressure. In Fiji most of the teaching is done from the whiteboard whereas at Aparima there is more time for teachers to spend with each student, and most of the work is done online. In Fiji students must sit at their desks and not move. Uniform is also strict in Fiji, for example girls wear ribbons in their plaits, and boys wear a formal sulu. Here, the first thing the daughters did was to get their hair cut. If you see Mrs Lata and her family around, please say "bula!" which is the same as saying 'kia ora!'.

Attendance

2023 HPV Immunisation for Year 8 Students



The HPV vaccine is funded for girls and boys aged 9-26 years (inclusive) with all students in Year 8 able to have the HPV immunisation at school. The HPV vaccine protects against future infection from nine types of human papillomavirus that lead to cervical, anal, genital, mouth and throat cancers, as well as genital warts. The HPV vaccine is the final immunisation given as part of New Zealand's free childhood immunisation programme.

All year 8 students will be given a form to take home which includes detailed information about the immunisation. **Please complete the form, either consenting or declining** the <u>School</u>-Based Immunisation Programme and return the form to school before Friday February 17th.

The first HPV vaccine will be administered at school between late February and mid-May 2022. The second and final HPV vaccine will be administered at school a minimum of 6 months after the first. If a student is absent on the vaccination day, the HPV Immunisation Team will revisit school on a later date to vaccinate.
