Earthquake/Tsunami Response Update

During the recent earthquake event, our leadership team acted swiftly to ensure student safety. With limited information at the time—and conflicting reports from Geonet—we made the decision to evacuate all students and staff to the Riverton Racecourse once we confirmed the earthquake originated in the Puysegur Trench and was reported at a magnitude of 6.9. This response followed our school's standard evacuation procedures.

We are pleased to share that Civil Defence has commended Aparima College for our prompt and effective response, even using us as an example for other schools. Their message remains clear: "Long and strong, get gone." The quake was confirmed to have lasted four minutes with a magnitude of 6.8.

New Civil Defence Guidance:

Any future earthquake in the Puysegur Trench with a magnitude of 6.5 or above and a depth of less than 100 km will now trigger an immediate evacuation. To support this, school leadership has installed emergency alert apps that will provide direct notifications. These are now operational.

Additionally, Civil Defence has added our leadership team's contact numbers to their emergency alert system, ensuring we receive evacuation instructions directly—alongside Police, Fire, and Ambulance services. Please note, there may still be a brief delay in receiving these official texts due to Civil Defence's internal processes.

We will continue to prioritise safety in all emergency situations.



Bus Safety Reminders

Student Safety

Student safety is of paramount importance. Schools are responsible for regularly reminding caregivers and students on how to keep students safe before, during and after using a school bus.

Reminders for parents and caregivers:

- Caregivers are responsible for safely transporting their children to and from their school bus stop and as such are best placed to decide the safest way to do this.
- Stick to the speed limit: it's 20kph when passing a stopped school bus (on either side of the road).
- Drop your tamariki off on the same side of the road as the bus stop.
- Teach your tamariki to always get out of the car on the side closest to the curb.
- Always take your tamariki to and from the bus-stop.
- Teach your tamariki not to run across the road.
- Remind your tamariki on how to keep safe boarding and disembarking the bus:
- While waiting at the bus stop, keep well back from the road.
- Wait until the bus has completely stopped and the door opens before getting on.
- After getting off the bus, stand well back from the road and wait until the bus has gone and you can see clearly before moving.







My smaller spaceball shown here is from the same spacecraft, Cosmos 482, which broke up in April 1972. This fuel tank was found in the Hakataramea Valley two years later. Great for students to hold! The large spaceball washed ashore in 2004.

Antarctica Been there for a week in 2000 and I've been five times to the Subantarctic islands as far as Macquarie Island. I've got a bag of Antarctic gear
