(a word from the Principal's desk)

Kia ora e te whānau,

Welcome to 2026. What a joyful start we have had to the year. Students have settled quickly and are already into their work and it is great to see students signing up for sports and clubs. On Monday (16th February) we will have our formal welcome pōwhiri, we will be starting at 9am, you are welcome to come along. We ask that you are at school by 8:45am, if you have been welcomed to school previously then please join mana whenua inside the hall and if you are new to the Aparima Whānau, please wait outside the hall with the new students and staff.

There is much going on in Education in 2026; we will keep you informed of upcoming changes that affect your child, including new reporting language and expectations, assessments and any major curriculum changes.

Students are looking very smart in their uniform. A reminder that correct school uniform is expected, all information is available on the school website. Please contact the school if you are having difficulty with any aspects of the uniform.

The school is now required to report daily to the Ministry of Education on attendance. Regular school attendance has been a matter of concern at Aparima College for several years. As a community we have failed to improve the regular attendance rates of the school. It is essential for all learners to maintain regular attendance, to do this, no more than 5 days each term should be missed. This will ensure your child remains in the “green”. The majority of our learners who fail to achieve positive learning outcomes and success at NCEA have irregular attendance at school. The school web site outlines the Schools Attendance Action Plan, and the STAR Attendance Plan.

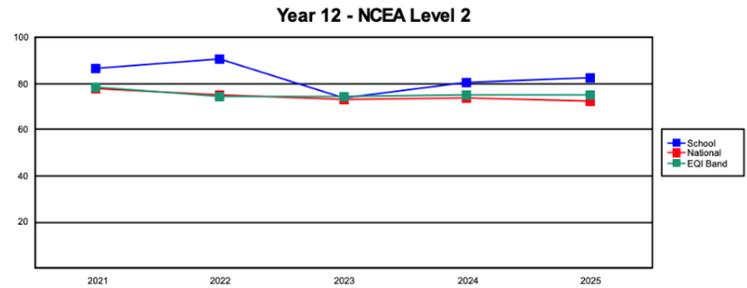

Achievement remains consistently above national and EQI-band averages.

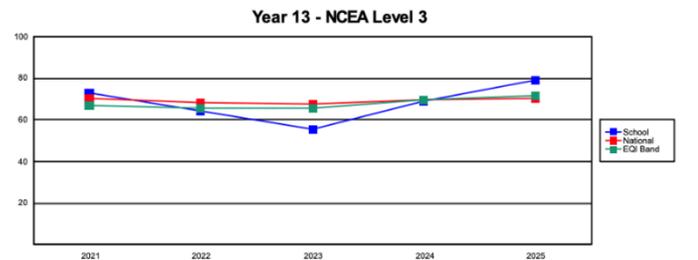
Over five years, results range from **73%–90%**, with **2025 at 82.4%**.

Performance has remained stable compared with equity-band schools (EQI Band: Above Average Socioeconomic Barriers).



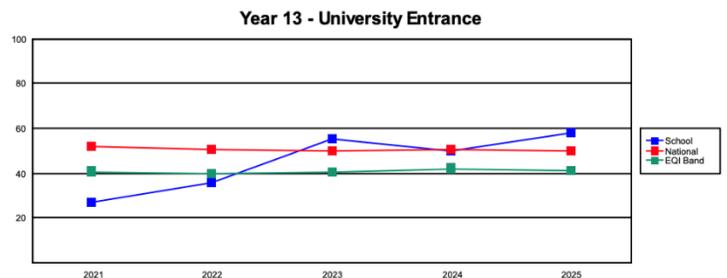
NCEA Level 3 (Year 13)

Achievements fluctuate between **55%–79%**, with **2025 showing strong improvement at 78.9%**. School performance is **at or above national** in most years.



University Entrance (Year 13)

Showing significant improvement and achieving the **highest rates of success in 5 years**



Results improved from 27% (2021) to ~58% (2025).

The trend shows steady growth, with the 2025 cohort performing above the national EQI band.

Messages to Students

If you wish to leave a message for your child, this must be phoned through to the College office by 11:30 am. We cannot promise that messages will get to your child if left after 12 noon.

Attendance

Students should ensure they are at school and in their Form Class by 8:40am and leave by 3:00 pm unless otherwise indicated. If your son or daughter is absent, please contact us by 9:00 am on the day of the absence, with your child's name, reason for the absence and the name of the person phoning/texting in. Texts will be sent to parents/caregivers for unexplained absences. Students arriving late MUST sign in at the office when they arrive. There are personnel in the office from 8:00 am onwards, or a message may be left on the answer phone.

Leaving the College Grounds

All students who leave the college during the day MUST have permission from the school as well as their parents/caregivers contacting the college office to advise a reason for leaving. The students MUST sign out through the office. Late students and those returning to the college MUST sign in at the office. Exeat passes are available to town students who wish to go HOME ONLY FOR LUNCH on a regular basis. Reminder to Senior students – if you wish to drive a vehicle to school you must collect a permission form from the office and get this signed by a parent/caregiver and return to the office. Note that you need to bring your driver's licence to the office to be copied. (A new form needs to be filled in every year so although you did this last year you need to do it again this year).

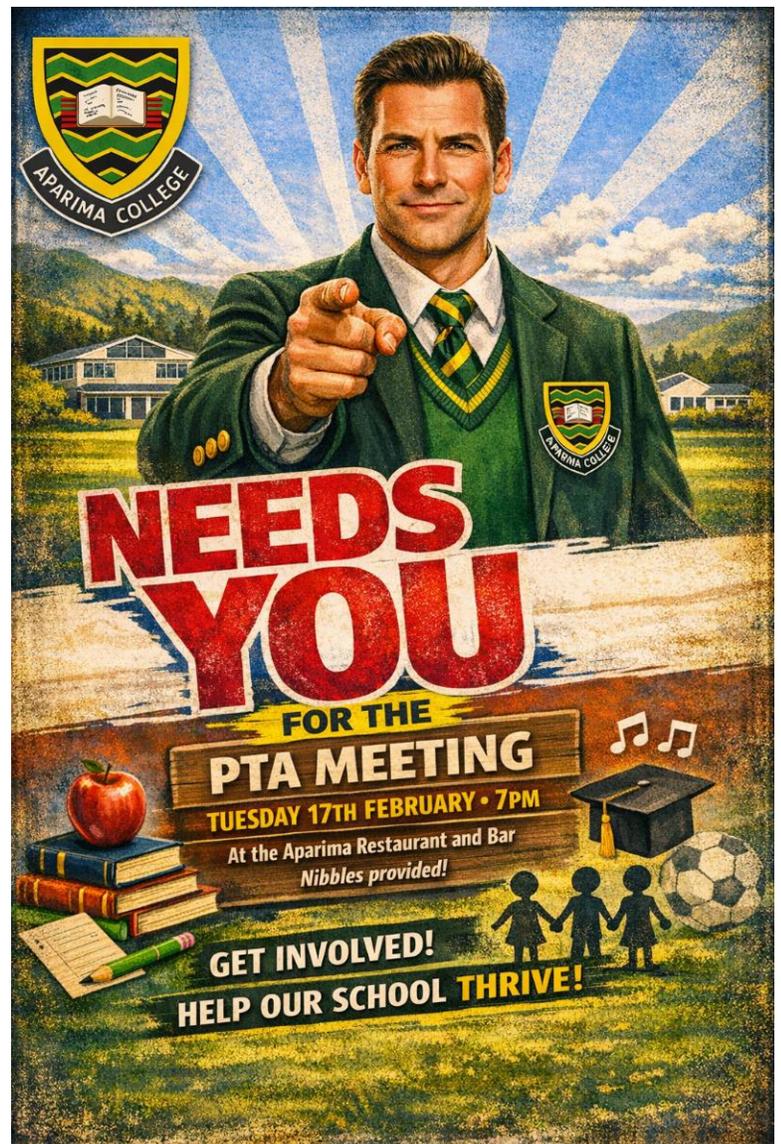
On **Fridays**, Students will need to be wearing covered shoes if they have Science, Hard Materials or Food Tech.

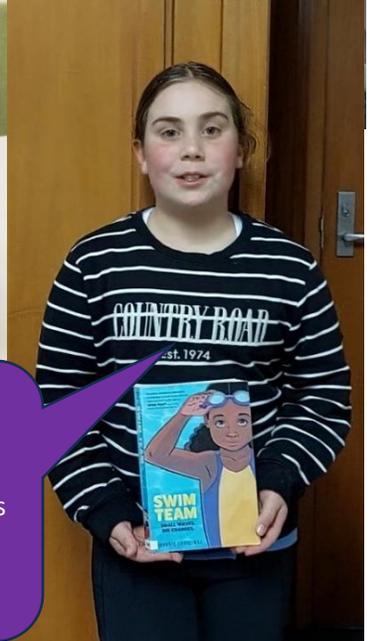

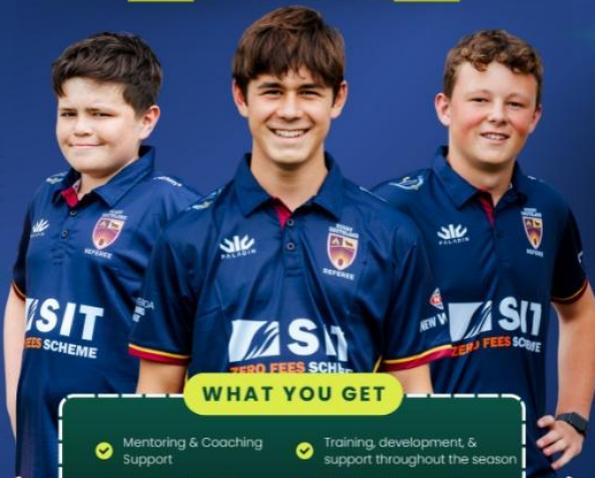

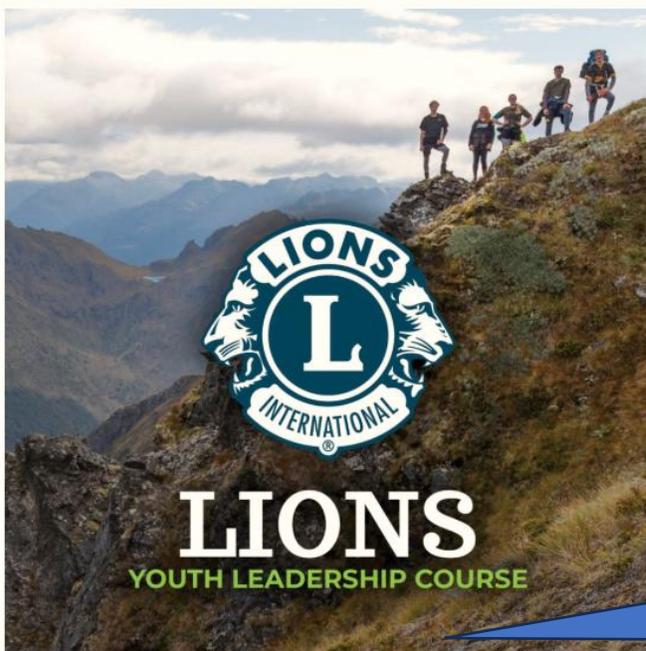

Update as of the 28 November 2025 regarding the School Jacket: From the start of December 25 it will be encouraged that all new students that wish to wear a jacket at school should look at purchasing the Aparima College Soft Shell Jacket which can be purchased from the UShop in Invercargill

As of the start of Term 1 in 2028 all students who wish to wear a jacket will be required to wear the Aparima College School Soft Shell Jacket, and all other jackets will not be allowed to be worn at school. Until the start of 2028 students can either wear a plain black jacket (can be worn outdoors only) or an Aparima College black shell jacket (this one can be worn in class).
